



### Treating Children's Fractures

Q & A WITH

### Dr. Mark Schwartz

PEDIATRIC ORTHOPEDIC SURGEON

Q: Summer activities can mean more injuries, possibly broken bones. Is a broken bone the same thing as a

**A:** A fracture is the medical terminology for a broken bone, so a break and a fracture are the same thing.

### Q: What are the most common fractures in children?

A: The most common fractures we see in children are wrist and elbow fractures. When kids fall, they tend to reach out with the arms. Wrist fractures are the No. 1 thing I see in my office.

### Q: Do children's bones heal faster than adults?

A: Kids definitely will heal faster than adults. There's a layer of tissue surrounding the bones that is a lot thicker in children, creating better blood flow to the bones, so their fractures tend to heal faster than adults'.

### Q: How are children's fractures different from adults' fractures?

**A:**A lot of pediatric fractures involve the growth plate, which requires different care

than that of an adult. It's really important that those fractures are taken care of quickly and appropriately so the kids can continue to grow normally. Pediatric orthopedic surgeons have extra training specifically for treating growth-plate fractures

### Q: How does a parent know when an injury is serious enough to seek care?

A: If kids fall and have an obvious deformity of their arm or leg, they need to be seen immediately because they likely need to be reset in the emergency department or in the operating room, if necessary. Non-displaced fractures are more difficult to discern. If kids start to have swelling or bruising, are not bearing weight on a leg, or if they're crying for more than 20-30 minutes after an injury, they should be seen by a doctor. If a kid is quickly consolable and isn't hurting within an hour or two, then it's probably OK. But if parents have any concern, getting them in and getting an X-ray is always a good option to avoid delaying care for an injury that may need care sooner rather than later.

**ONCE UPON A TIME,** I did not like books that referenced writing or books or authors in any way. "Writers who write about writing are lazy," I sniffed. "Meta for meta's sake!"

When I moved into children's librarianship over a decade ago, a ton of fantastic children's books about books (and, it has to be said, A.S. Byatt's classic novel, *Possession*) quickly changed my mind.

And, I quickly learned, early literacy theory solidified why these "meta" books are great for children developing both print motivation and print knowledge. Books that make books look fun and cool — and books that teach kids how to read books — are always a good thing.

Because there are SO MANY great children's books about books and reading, I've had to cut my recommendations in two—expect "Books About Books, Part 2" in August!

**Warning: Do Not Open This Book!** written by Adam
Lehrhaupt and illustrated by
Matthew Forsythe

I start with this one because it opened my eyes to the "this book is magical and dangerous and you don't want to read it!" sub-genre of picture books about books. Opening the book and turning the pages releases monkeys, toucans and a very dangerous alligator — but readers discover that this chaos is actually wonderful, and books make it possible!

**How To Read a Book** written by Kwame Alexander and illustrated by Melissa Sweet

Comparing reading books to eating delectable fruits and other delicious treats, this special book by award winners Alexander and Sweet is also beautiful to look at, with collages made of watercolor, found objects and colorful paint.

I Will Chomp You! written by Jory John and illustrated by Bob Shea

Get ready to laugh! This book is protected by a monster who WILL chomp you if you get too close to his yummy cakes! A particularly fun one-on-one read with your child, but it does not

disappoint with larger groups because it is just so silly.

### **A Unicorn, A Dinosaur, and a Shark Walk Into a Book** written and illustrated by

written and illustrated by Jonathan Fenske

Reminiscent of the Italian play Six Characters In Search of an Author — but a whole lot funnier and, if possible, even more surreal — this book tells you exactly what it's about. The best part is that the aforementioned unicorn, dinosaur and shark don't really listen to their creator. Hilarity ensures, as well as an understanding of how books are made!

### Books By Horseback: A Librarian's Brave Journey to Deliver Books to Children writ-

ten by Emma Carlson Berne and illustrated by Ilaria Urbinati

Using realistic yet sweepingly beautiful illustrations, this picture book introduces children to early library history (which warms *this* librarian's heart!), in which brave men and women traveled by horse over treacherous terrain to get books into the

hands of kids. Watch out — your kid may just want to become a librarian after reading this.

While the above are all picture books, I would be remiss if I didn't include at least two of my favorite chapter books for older children that also feature books and reading.

### The Parker Inheritance


by Varian Johnson


















# How to Prep your Child for Kindergarten

For many parents, kindergarten signals an important transition from the all-consuming baby and toddler years. Suddenly, your "baby" is expected to make more choices on her own, stay focused over a longer period of time, learn new skills and navigate a social circle with less oversight from you. Taking time now to plan ahead can pave the road to a happier kindergarten transition for all.



#### 1 | Visit the school.

Before school begins, attend school orientations and meet the teacher to help your child grow familiar with the new learning environment.

#### 2 | Calm kindergarten jitters.

Build excitement and optimism for school. Shop together for a new backpack or lunchbox, school supplies and new clothes.

#### 3 | Recognize friendly faces.

Before school starts, arrange play dates with future classmates, if you can. A few familiar faces on the first day may help calm any nervous butterflies.

#### 4 | Read together.

Reading to your child teaches valuable listening skills and creates an opportunity to help your child prepare for the kindergarten experience. Check out books like *The Night Before Kindergarten* by Natasha Wing and *Kindergarten Rocks* by Katie Davis.

#### 5 | Tackle a few skills.

While knowing colors, the ABCs and how to count to 10 will give children a head start, work on

other skills such as teaching them to tie shoes, know their name and their birthday.

#### 6 | Plan transportation.

Avoid transportation snafus by sticking to a plan and keeping your child (and the teacher) informed. If your child will ride the bus and is nervous, listen and be reassuring. Drive the route ahead of time. Also, seek out a "bus buddy" for your child, whether a responsible older neighbor child or another bus-riding classmate. On the first day of school, arrive early at the bus stop. Introduce yourself and your child to the driver. Assure your child that you (or whomever you've designated) will be waiting when the bus returns after school.

## 7 | Get good eats and sweet dreams.

Make sure your new kindergartener gets plenty of rest (10–12 hours of sleep) and eats healthy meals. Wake up a little earlier to avoid a rushed first day.

#### 8 | Team up with the teacher.

Share insights about your child's strengths with the teacher.

"Parents should approach school with the idea that the teacher has their child's best interest at heart," says Dr. Holly Schiffrin, an associate professor of psychology at the University of Mary Washington, who specializes in child development and parenting practices. "The parent should convey that they are on the same team as the teacher (even if they have different ideas about how to assist their child)."

#### 9 | Reflect on the day.

Having a hard time getting your child to discuss his day? "Keeping a daily journal of their day (with mom's help) is a fun way to get your kids to talk about school," says kindergarten teacher Wendy Hughes. "Ask your child to tell you some funny or interesting things that may have happened that day."

#### 10 | Manage adversity.

Every child is bound to have a rough day. Encourage them to resolve their own problems and take responsibility for their actions

"Ask your child for her input and perspective, genuinely listen, acknowledge and empathize, and then shift the focus toward reaching solutions as a family and in unison with your teachers and school," says parent coach Tom Limbert, author of Dad's Playbook: Wisdom for Fathers from the Greatest Coaches of All Time. "Focus on giving your child the tools, morals and lessons she will need when not in your presence, which will now be more and more often."

#### 11 | Mark the occasion.

Celebrate your child's first day of school with a special outing after school like getting a frozen yogurt, dinner out or a playdate at a favorite park. Who knows? You may find that initial celebration turns into an annual first-day-of-school tradition for your family.

What do children gain from early learning, and how do parents know that their child's school is developmentally appropriate for young children? Armed with knowledge, parents can make confident choices and be important partners in their children's early education.

According to Dr. Anita Ede, professor of Early Childhood Education at Northeastern State University Broken Arrow, locating a good preschool is essential for ensuring that children are provided with a solid educational introduction that will positively impact their future experience in school.

"Attending preschool is important now more than ever because by the time they get to kindergarten, the expectations are so great - things have really sped up," Ede said.

Ede is an advocate of play-based learning and does not support the ever-increasing academic demands being placed on an age group that is still learning self-help skills, how to share and how to be empathetic toward others. She believes that high quality, developmentally appropriate pre-K programs are important because they encourage a love of learning in children that continues well beyond kindergarten.

Some of the knowledge that children acquire through preschool and pre-K programs include

writing their first name, recognizing and writing letters, knowing letter sounds, and recognizing, writing and counting numerals 1-10.

Ideally, Ede said, "It's going to be a gentle learning that they will receive through playing, listening to good literature and playing in centers."

In addition to academics, developmentally appropriate preschool and pre-K programs guide children to interact and socialize with their peers and teachers, and to regulate their emotions. Preschoolers develop the ability to share, show empathy and cooperate with others. They also are exposed to the idea that other people may see the world differently than they do.

#### Choosing a Preschool

When deciding on a preschool, Ede recommends that parents visit potential preschools while they are in session, plan to meet with the director and teacher, and observe a classroom. This approach enables parents to ask questions and form opinions of the facility and the faculty while determining if the program will provide a developmentally appropriate and engaging curriculum.

#### 1 | Teacher Certification

"The number one thing that you're going to look for is teacher certification," Dr. Ede said. "When you have teachers that have no early childhood education at all,

they will not know how to spot developmental problems, and this is important because teachers are often the first to notice these."

Receiving necessary support as early as possible is crucial for ensuring children are able to thrive in school and in life.

Ede also notes that certified teachers are more knowledgeable about proper discipline for 3and 4-year-olds, as well as what expectations and activities are developmentally appropriate.

Because children who are between the ages of 3 and 4 are adjusting to the school environment and are still learning many of the social and emotional skills that elementary children already possess, they must be guided to learn acceptable behaviors.

Due to the impact that proper teacher education and certification has within preschool classrooms, Ede urges parents to always ask the principal or director if teachers are certified in early childhood education (ECE).

#### 2 | Curriculum and Academics

Next, Ede recommends inquiring about the curriculum and teaching methods. Parents should ask what kind of curriculum the school uses, as some schools use a purchased curriculum as opposed to the preferable teacher-created curriculum.

"When preschools use a purchased curriculum, they are making the assumption that all children in the classroom will be interested in the exact same material being taught in the exact same way all of the time. This does not take into account the diverse nature of classrooms," she said. "In contrast, when preschools hire highly qualified teachers who take all of these things into consideration when planning curriculum, children are more likely to have a positive learning experience."

Ede also suggests asking both the director and the teacher how they address academics.

"I would want to find out if the children are required to sit for an hour and do worksheets," she said. "This is not developmentally appropriate. You really want them to say that the curriculum is play-based because children learn best when they play."

It's also important for parents to find out if teachers use lesson plans to guide their teaching to ensure that children are engaged in meaningful activities that are aligned to standards. Ede says that parents should ask to receive examples of lesson plans, as these should be posted and available for them to view. In the case that teachers do not use lesson plans, or they are not available for viewing, Ede advises parents to take their preschool search elsewhere.



A quality preschool program features the following elements:

- The use of thematic units that are based on the students' interests.
- Classroom centers that are changed on a weekly basis (This not only challenges children but prevents boredom).
- Valuable experiences such as being able to have meaningful interactions with special visitors.
- The possibility for field trips.

Look for a classroom environment in which students play a role in their own learning process rather than passively taking in new information.

#### 3 | Student-Teacher Interaction

Request a classroom visit. During the classroom visit, parents will be able to assess their own feelings about the classroom environment, including the relationship between the students and the teachers, and whether the children seem to be content and engaged. Ede says that parents will easily pick up on the overall tone of the room as well as the level of responsiveness shown by the teacher.

"You're looking for a teacher that's warm and caring and isn't dismissive." Ede said.

## 4 | Physical Environment and Educational Materials

While state-of-the-art equipment and toys certainly can make a preschool seem impressive,

Ede says they aren't necessities. In addition to visible cleanliness, Ede advises parents to look for the following features:

- Child-sized furniture
- Equipment for centers, including a dramatic play area such as a kitchen or housekeeping center
- Well-maintained playground that includes:
  - A full fence
  - Safe, appropriately sized equipment (no access to equipment for older elementary children)
- Opportunities for shade

Look for toys and materials that foster the expression of creativity and the development of problem-solving skills.

Diversity is another important element in the classroom. For example, the housekeeping center should have dolls with a variety of physical features and skin colors. The same should be true of the classroom's book collection, with diverse cultures, races, ages and other differences represented in age-appropriate books.

Ede notes that the presence of books is an essential component of any quality preschool classroom to promote literacy skills and a love for reading.

# Choosing a Private School: PreK-12<sup>th</sup> Grade

When it comes to the finding the best educational fit for your child, there is no one-size-fits-all. As you begin to assess the best school environment, start with your child. Visit with other parents about their experiences. Go to the National Association of Private Schools for information on evaluating schools (napsschools.org).

## Here are some things to consider when choosing a private school:

- Consider your child's temperament, academic ability and interests. If your child loves art, but the school you're considering doesn't have art class, you may want to choose another school or figure out how to add art to your child's day.
- 2. Structure and environment. How does your child work best? Your neighbor's child may love the open classroom concept and fluid movement at their school, but an open environment may make your child anxious.
- **3.** Discipline. Does the school's approach to dealing with discipline problems align with your family's values?
- 4. Religious or secular. What is the school philosophy? If it's a religious school, does it align with your family's religious values? What is the expectation for student involvement in religion at the school? What is the school's philosophy, and what is their mission?
- **5.** How does the school communicate with parents?
- **6.** Beyond tuition, what other financial obligations will parents have?
- 7. What is the school's safety plan, and what security measures does the school have?
- **8.** How does the school handle bullying? Is there a written policy?
- 9. Is the school accredited? If so, by what organization?
- **10.** What is the training of the staff, administration and teachers? Are background checks done on all employees?
- **11.** What kind of counseling and support is available for students, both academic and personal?
- **12.** Is the school aligned with state standards? How does the school evaluate students?
- **13.** Are there opportunities for students to be involved in sports, drama and other activities?
- **14.** What is the make-up of the student body? Is it diverse?
- **15.** Does the school have accommodations for students with special needs or learning differences?



# Supporting Your Gifted Child

Many people don't realize that parenting an intellectually gifted child is truly parenting a child with special needs. These needs are founded in strengths, but they do require special attention and extra resources. Parenting a child with special needs, of any variety, requires extra time, money and energy.

You may be wondering whether your child is gifted. Generally, a child who has an I.Q. of 130 or more is considered intellectually gifted. The National Association for Gifted Children (NAGC) defines giftedness as children who have ability significantly above the norm for their age in one or more domains, including: intellectual, creative, artistic, leadership, or in a specific academic field such as language arts, mathematics or science. Giftedness exists

in all demographic groups and personality types.

According to the National Association for Gifted Children (nagc.org), in 2014-2015, Oklahoma had identified 97,186 gifted students out of a total population of 688,300. The state mandates identification and services for gifted and talented students (sde.ok.gov/gifted-and-talented-education). The website for the Oklahoma Association for the Gifted, Creative & Talented is oagct.org.

There are many formal assessments to determine whether a child is gifted, and it's helpful to identify children early. However, testing is usually not recommended before age 5. Here are some common traits of gifted children, but remember that each child is unique and may not display all of these traits.



## **Traits of Gifted Children**

- 1 | Gifted children often command a large vocabulary. They will frequently prefer adult conversation to those with their peers. It is important to encourage your gifted child to engage with same-age peers. Not doing so can lead to a sense of isolation
- 2 | Intellectually gifted children often display strong feelings and can be very opinionated. Because they are also often very self-aware, they may recognize that they are different. This may lead them to feel left out. Many become introverted. It may be helpful to consider a school for gifted children where the student will be surrounded by others who are similar

Tulsa is fortunate to have The University of Tulsa University School. Both of my sons attended. One didn't "fit in" socially when attending public school. He truly blossomed when placed with others more like him. I witnessed a substantial jump in his self-confidence.

- **3** I Young gifted children may become bored easily. They learn by being exposed to new stimuli. At home, you may find that the gifted child loses interest in new toys quickly. Be prepared to expand your toy budget.
- 4 | Gifted children frequently focus intensely on one specific interest. One of my sons wanted to learn everything about dinosaurs. At age 6 or 7, he undoubtedly knew more about dinosaurs than the average adult. I've also taught some gifted children. One of these children was fanatical about trains. Everything he drew or wrote about dealt with trains. This was one of the signs I recognized in him when I requested that he be tested.
- 5 | Gifted children are able to teach themselves and can remember things easily. Some may be reading and writing before they ever attend school. They may be able to solve a new type of math problem by using logic and reasoning.
- 6 | These children may have an original way of expressing themselves. You may find that they are able to write extremely well. Their stories may be very complex and well developed.

- 7 | Gifted children often exhibit an advanced sense of humor. They may understand humor that their peers do not. Gifted children may also be highly sensitive with intense feelings.
- 8 | Gifted students frequently prefer to work alone, rather than in groups. This may be due to their unique methods of approaching their work or a feeling of social awkwardness.
- **9** I All children seem to ask a lot of questions. However, the gifted child will ask even more! The questions may be very deep and detailed as these children try to satisfy their thirst for knowledge and understanding. At times, this can be challenging for parents and teachers. It's important to be patient with these children, as we don't want to squelch their curiosity.
- 10 | A parent or teacher may notice that a gifted child learns more quickly. It is estimated that most children need eight to 15 repetitions in order to learn something new. Gifted children frequently need only one or two.

If you suspect that you may be parenting a gifted child, you may have your child tested by a psychologist. However, many schools offer the same tests at no charge to families.

If you learn that your child is gifted, it is important to realize that you are parenting a child with special needs. It does require more from you. You will want to encourage your child's curiosity. You will need to provide a plethora of stimuli for your gifted child. You will also want to consider the educational possibilities. You may decide that your child can best be served at a school for gifted children. If this is not an option, you will need to check what services are provided for gifted children at your child's school. If it's not enough, you may wish to consider hiring a private tutor or providing enrichment activities after school. Visit with your child's teacher. Inquire as to how your child's special needs will be met in the classroom. There is such a focus on the students falling behind that some teachers are less aware that gifted children need special attention, too.

#### Why should I have my child tested?

According to the National Association for Gifted Children (NAGC), public school districts often use "subject-specific, standardized achievement or group ability tests to identify students that qualify for gifted programming." You may decide to have your child independently tested as well.

# Ask yourself the following questions before deciding to have your child tested:

- Are there indicators—such as academic performance, social-emotional characteristics, or certain behaviors—that makes me suspect my child is gifted?
- Is my child not thriving or unhappy in his current learning environment?
- Is my child applying to a gifted and talented enrichment program, camp, online course or independent gifted school where test results are required for admission?
- Does my child demonstrate giftedness, but it's not recognized because I suspect other factors (such as a learning disability, ADHD or anxiety, for example) may be getting in the way?

If the answer is "yes," to any of the above questions, you might want to pursue having your child tested privately.

Parenting is a tricky thing. Just when you think you've got things figured out, everything's upended. If beginning kindergarten can seem like an adjustment, transitioning to middle school can seem like a seismic shift. For parents and kids alike, change can be stressful. Fortunately, there are some things you can do to make this often-tumultuous time more bearable for evervone.

#### Accept that middle school is an adjustment

In general, middle schools are larger, both as a facility and in the number of students, than elementary schools.

Day-to-day school life is different. Now there may be multiple teachers, increased travel between classes, more academic responsibility and even an "impersonal" feel. On the positive side, middle school is like a launching pad — kids begin to have more agency and learn how to make decisions for themselves, and also see the consequences of those decisions.

#### **Anxiety and social fears**

Students headed to middle school often have concerns - everything from finding the classroom to finding a friend at lunch. It's a time when kids start to pull away from their

parents and start to rely more on their peers. Being a part of the group, fitting in, becomes much more important than it was when they were younger. Add an increased academic load, and anxiety can skyrocket.

There are some things you can do to help alleviate your child's stress. Help your child with time management and organizational skills. Although they're expected to shoulder more of the responsibility for their own work now, they may still need your help figuring out how to balance it all. Teach your child to be his or her own advocate, encouraging them to discuss problems with their teachers on their own, but be ready to step in, if necessary. Don't overreact to grades. Instead, help your child get a handle on the demands of the new school.

To help ease the social transition, encourage your child to join a sports team or a club. Talk with your child about traits that make a good friend and talk about social skills - how your words and actions can affect others. If weekends are lonely at first, encourage your child to schedule weekend activities with friends from the neighborhood or grade

Keep the lines of communication open. This is a time when young people become more socially

aggressive as they jostle for a place among the social hierarchy. Even if your child isn't on the giving or receiving end, bullying, teasing and exclusion become more prevalent at this age, whether in real life, or in the digital world. Encourage your children to talk to you about what they might be experiencing or what they are witnessing.

#### Middle school: an adjustment for parents, too

Just as a child may be overwhelmed going from an intimate grade-school setting to what can seem like the Wild West of middle school, parents, too, can be caught off guard by the changes. Multiple teachers can mean that no one teacher knows your child as well as his or her grade-school teacher did. Middle-school teachers may seem less responsive and harder to reach because they're responsible for many more students. Remember, this doesn't mean the teachers are unapproachable, it just means they have more obligations on their time.

Parents may feel their own peer pressure to parent "like everyone else." However, the popular thing may not be the right decision for your family. Trust your gut and don't be afraid to think independently for your child and your values. Create your own

"village" of parents for support and camaraderie.


Understand that it's normal for your child to change, and that some of these changes may be challenging. Middle school is a time to grow more independent, and this can mean complaints, arguments, delays and disobedience. Testing limits is often a daily activity. Try to respond calmly to your child's challenges. While middle school kids still need their parents to protect and guide them, they also need opportunities to make their own decision and handle their own conflicts as they grow in independence.

As your child begins to pull away from you and turn to friends for support and advice, it's tempting to take a more hands-off approach to your parenting. While your relationship is definitely evolving, you are still a necessary presence and voice in your child's life. They continue to need your mentoring, your guidance and, most of all, your love, to smooth the path.







#### How long do you have to wear braces — and is Invisalign an option?

Once patients are fitted with braces, the length of time they stay on depends on each individual and how many teeth they need moved and the distance they are moved. Some patients only need them for a few months, others for a few years.

When the braces come off, that doesn't mean they are done with the treatment, either. Retainers are worn by patients in order to maintain the position of the teeth. Some retainers are permanent, with wire affixed to the back of the teeth. Some retainers are removable. Again, the type that is used is dependent on the patient's needs.

Invisalign has become very popular in recent years, and many inquire about it due to it being less noticeable. We usually reserve this treatment for older patients who don't need as much movement. Brackets and wires are preferred for younger patients because they tend to be more effective for individuals requiring more movement.
